The 122 run defeat Gloucestershire suffered at Chelmsford in 2011 is the heaviest in terms of runs against ANY county for Gloucestershire in the T20. The first three Gloucestershire batsmen H J H Marshall, A P R Gidman & C G Taylor all scored a duck at Chelmsford in 2011. The unbeaten 3<sup>rd</sup> wicket partnership of 112 between T Westley & R S Bopara for Essex at Chelmsford in 2014 is a

competition record for any county against Gloucestershire. M Klinger's innings of 126no at Bristol in 2015 is the highest ever individual score by a Gloucestershire batsman in the T20. T M J Smith achieved the first & only hat-trick for Gloucestershire in the T20 dismissing G R Napier, R S ten Doeschate & D D Masters. The stand of 71 no by M Klinger and J K Fuller is an all counties record for the 8<sup>th</sup> wicket for Gloucestershire in the 20/20 and a record in the domestic UK tournament beating the 68 added by M W Alleyne and J Lewis for Gloucestershire versus Glamorgan at Cardiff in 2005. The 2011 match at Bristol on 17th June was abandoned without play or a toss due to a waterlogged outfield. The 2017 match at Chelmsford was televised and a 5 over contest was originally arranged, then Gloucestershire won the toss and fielded but no play was possible but this match still counts as an appearance for all 22 players selected. B A C Howell in the 2017 match at Bristol recorded the 2<sup>nd</sup> best economical bowling performance for Gloucestershire 4-0-8-1 only bettered by M W Alleyne 4-0-6-1 v Worcestershire at Worcester in 2005. The 2018 match at Cheltenham was abandoned after 18.2 overs, the match took place in the middle of a summer heatwave but was abandoned due to a heavy localised summer thunderstorm (there was no rain at all 5 miles away). The 2018 match at Chelmsford was abandoned without a toss due to a wet outfield. The 2019 match at Chelmsford televised by Sky Sports was also abandoned without a toss due to steady rain & a waterlogged outfield. The 3<sup>rd</sup> wicket stand of 105 by Essex in 2019 between T Westley & D W Lawrence was a Bristol ground record for the 3<sup>rd</sup> wicket against Gloucestershire in T20 from 2003-2021.

- B A C Howell has hit 49 sixes for Gloucestershire in 98 matches (81 innings batted)
- On 17/6/2021 **Daniel J Worrall** became the 87<sup>th</sup> different player to play for Gloucestershire in T20 cricket in the 200<sup>th</sup> match played by the County since 2003. Also on the same day

**T M J Smith** played his 100<sup>th</sup> T20 match for Gloucestershire from GCCC debut 2013-2021

(141 matches for all counties) he became the 3<sup>rd</sup> Gloucestershire player to reach 100 matches after I A Cockbain 126 matches & H J H Marshall 106 matches played. In the **Middlesex** innings **R F Higgins** took his 50<sup>th</sup> T20 wicket (37 for Gloucestershire 2018-2021) when dismissing E J G Morgan caught by M A H Hammond. Also

I A Cockbain has now scored 556 runs v Middlesex 2011-2021 which is the most runs for a Gloucestershire batsman versus a **specific county** beating the 548 runs by M Klinger v Glamorgan 2013-2019 & the 530 runs scored by H J H Marshall v Somerset 2007-2016, these are the only 3 instances of a batsman scoring >500 runs versus a **specific county.** On Duckworth, Lewis & Stern (DLS) Gloucestershire won by 2 runs, the narrowest win (by runs) in matches since 2003 is the one run victory v Worcestershire at Bristol 2006. There has been only one 3 run win v Warwickshire at Edgbaston too. **Middlesex** conceded only 1 extra (1 leg bye) in the 18 overs they bowled at Gloucestershire this is the fewest extras ever conceded versus Gloucestershire in T20 equalling the 1 extra (1 wide) conceded by Glamorgan at Cardiff 2021.
